in the meantime, the babies had to gain some weight. At their birth, both of them together weighed under 11 pounds.

Finally, it was time. The surgeons entered the operating room. Assisted by a medical team trained by Project HOPE, they spent six hours rapt in intense concentration, using every ounce of their skill to perform this demanding operation.

When Dr. Chen Qimin, the chief surgeon, strode out of the operating room in his scrubs, the parents knew in an instant it was good

news. "The surgery went very well, as planned," he said.

Even though challenges lie ahead for the girls, their parents are overjoyed. "We didn't expect our daughters to be discharged so soon," they said. "We're grateful for the efforts of the health care staff."

## Only a Painstaking Operation Could Save These Conjoined Newborns

### Your Support Saved Their Lives

It was a beautiful spring afternoon in China just outside the city of Shanghai. Everything seemed perfect for one couple, as they awaited the birth of their twin girls. They had faithfully followed the doctor's orders, took all the precautions and made all the preparations.

But on that special day in April, joy was replaced with pain when the doctors saw that the baby girls — little An An and Xin Xin — were conjoined twins, linked together at the chest and abdomen, putting both of their lives in jeopardy.

Within days of their birth, the girls were taken to the Shanghai Children's Medical Center. It was the only nearby facility with the resources to undertake the intricate surgery to separate the girls. This facility, one of the world's premier heart centers, performs lifesaving surgery on more than 3,400 children each year. Project HOPE helped to create this remarkable center for healing, and we continue to support it through your generous gifts.

The medical team devoted four months to working out the procedures for the operation. And

## THE RECOVERY CONTINUES: Five Months After the Philippines Typhoon

### An Inspiring Moment As the Hard Work Goes On

It happened in the Tapaz District Hospital, in a region of the Philippines that was in the direct path of the typhoon. An event that reminded all of us how fragile life is, and how tenacious.

Project HOPE nurses and doctors have been volunteering in this hospital since the typhoon hit last November, killing more than 6,000 people, leaving 2,000 missing and causing millions to lose their homes. In the midst of that devastation, nurse

The baby's mom was so overwhelmed by nurse Rochelle's compassion that she named her baby after her. And today, baby Rochelle is doing fine. It was an inspiring moment, revealing how much our work together really means.

And that's especially important since the recovery effort is ongoing. So far, with your generous support, we continue to help the people of the Philippines. **Here's just some of what we've been able to accomplish together:**

- More than \$16 million in medicines and medical supplies was shipped.

- 71 Project HOPE volunteers were sent.
- 5,562 patients were seen at outreach clinics, including the Tapaz District Hospital and the Rural Health Unit.
- 435 surgeries were performed.
- 1,711 educational and training contacts with community and health professionals.

This work goes on, powered by your support, and motivated by your compassion and love to help people in need rebuild their lives. **HOPE**

## UPDATE:

## The 1,000th Airlift of Medical Supplies Into Poverty Zones

This year, we commemorate the 1,000th airlift of medical supplies in cooperation with the U.S. Department of State — an occasion worth remembering!

It marks more than 20 years of compassionate people helping to send lifesaving medicine for those suffering with tuberculosis, pneumonia, hepatitis, diphtheria and other diseases in some of the toughest and poorest places on earth. Since 1992, we've been working with the U.S. Department of State to provide these urgently needed supplies, and your support has been a critical element of each project.

**Over the years, for example, the airlifts have provided:**

- \$378 million in medical supplies to Tajikistan.
- \$22 million in medical supplies to Kosovo.
- \$60 million in medical supplies to Haiti.

- \$108 million in medical supplies to Honduras and Nicaragua.
- \$98 million in medical supplies to Kyrgyzstan.
- \$7.5 million in medical supplies to Indonesia.

And that's just a sample of the lifesaving help given to people who are sick and suffering around the world.

With each airlift, we take special care to honor the generosity of everyone involved. For example, we work closely with health officials on the ground to see exactly what supplies they need. We make certain that the facilities receiving the supplies can store them properly. And we follow up to



ensure that the supplies are being used. Tight controls like this prevent waste, so that all the medicine that's sent goes to saving lives — just as you would want.

Just think about a tiny baby in a hospital in Kyrgyzstan burning up with fever — a case of pneumonia so bad it could kill him. The doctor has tragically lost infants like this before, because he didn't have medicine. But not this time. This time, he has the antibiotics to save this baby's life. In a few days, this little boy is well again, cooing and squirming in his crib. That's the urgent need that exists in so many poverty zones around the world. That's why we do these airlifts. And that's the real impact of your generous support. **HOPE**
