



Project HOPE's Ukraine Response

Project HOPE is implementing a highly coordinated, comprehensive humanitarian response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Our team is on the ground in Ukraine, Poland, Romania, and Moldova actively delivering medicines, medical supplies, mental health support, trauma care trainings, and other urgent assistance.

Emergency programming in Ukraine focuses on supporting local primary and secondary health facilities with essential medical equipment and supplies. The refugee responses in Moldova, Poland, and Romania have identified local partners to target gaps in essential services including primary health, mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS), and protection.

In all locations, Project HOPE continues to work closely with government officials, local partners, and coordination clusters to ensure efforts address the most pressing needs.
