

# 4 Years of Humanitarian Response



## UKRAINE

As the full-scale invasion of Ukraine enters its fifth year, Project HOPE's comprehensive health and humanitarian intervention is delivering both immediate relief and lasting change. With a continued focus on the most vulnerable populations in frontline areas, the team provides lifesaving assistance, cares for those who would otherwise not have access, and leads sustainable recovery efforts to strengthen long-term resilience.



### Strengthening Access to Health Care

- Equipping clinics and hospitals with essential medical supplies.
- Delivering lifesaving medicines to war-affected areas.
- Training health workers to meet evolving needs.
- Incentivizing surge staff to sustain overstretched services.
- Supporting emergency transportation and referral systems.
- Deploying mobile medical units to communities on the front lines.



### Addressing Urgent Humanitarian Needs

- Reconstruction and renovation of damaged health and social facilities.
- Mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) for internally displaced and war-affected communities.
- Distribution of water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) supplies.
- Provision of essential items to help families endure blackouts and harsh winter conditions.



### The Scale of Our Impact:

- Directly reached more than **2.1 million people** across Ukraine.
- Provided continuous support to **227 health facilities**.
- Continue operational presence through **five Project HOPE offices in Ukraine**.





## Medical Supplies and Essential Medicines

- Delivered essential pharmaceuticals, medical supplies, and equipment worth **over \$15 million**.
- Launched **two mobile pharmacies** and closed urgent gaps in medication access by providing **168,738 pharmaceutical items** to **2,765 patients** in remote and war-affected areas in Chernihiv and Sumy oblasts to close urgent gaps in medication access for remote and war-affected communities.



## Expanding Health Care Access

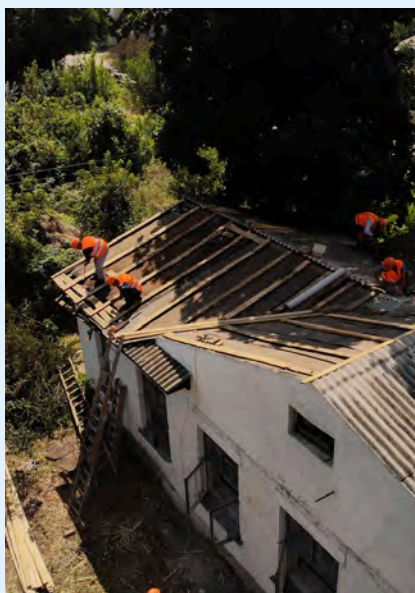


- Supported the operation of **79 mobile medical units** — involving **130 health workers** (doctors and nurses), 25 psychologists, 65 drivers, and multiple partner facilities — to provide care to **662,679 patients**.
- Supported **206 health workers** across **48 health facilities**, enabling continued care for **719,760 patients**.



## Health Infrastructure Recovery

- Reconstructed and repaired **20 health and social facilities**, improving access to services for more than **163,732 people**.



## Training and Health Workforce Support

- Trained **13,432 health workers** in basic life support, mental health care, and other essential clinical skills.





## Emergency Transportation and Ambulance Support

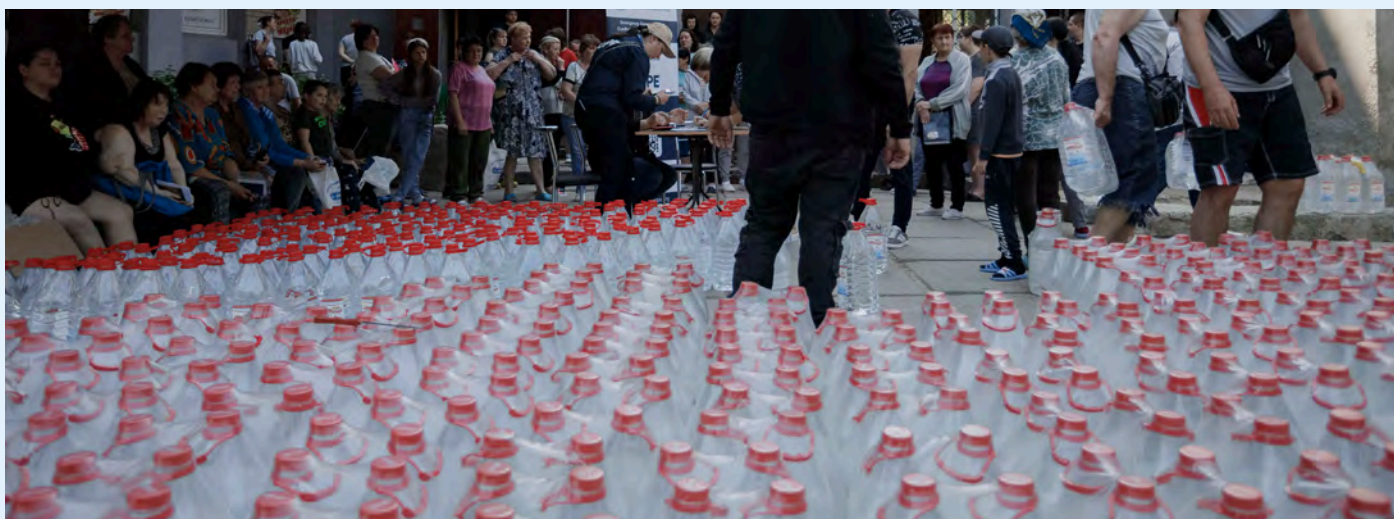


- Supplied **13 ambulances**, equipping first responders to conduct more than **36,029 patient transportations**.



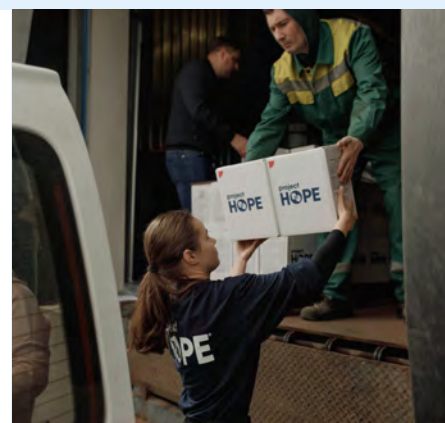
## Mental Health and Psychosocial Support

- Supported **357,843 people** through **five MHPSS Centers** and **eight IDP collective centers**.
- Provided MHPSS services through **46 hospitals** (in-person and virtual) and **25 mobile medical units**.



## Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH)

- Rehabilitated **seven boreholes** in Kherson and Kyiv oblasts, securing clean water access for more than **161,278 individuals**.
- Distributed **1.6 million** six-liter bottles of drinking water (approximately **9.5 million liters**) to **167,133 people**.
- Distributed **193,054 hygiene kits**, supporting **362,119 individuals** with essential sanitation and dignity supplies.







## POLAND

Since the start of the full-scale war in Ukraine, Poland has remained a critical hub for refugee response and cross-border humanitarian support. Project HOPE has maintained an active presence in Poland to meet urgent health and psychosocial needs among displaced Ukrainians while strengthening systems that support longer-term integration and recovery.

Through a combination of health care delivery, mental health services, social cohesion programming, and capacity building, Project HOPE continues to provide essential assistance to refugees and host communities alike.



### Strengthening Access to Health Care

- Supporting refugees with medical consultations, rehabilitation services, and specialized care.
- Providing medical supplies and equipment to health and social care facilities.
- Delivering services through facility-based support and community outreach.
- Expanding access to care through integrated health and psychosocial programming.



### Addressing Urgent Humanitarian Needs



- Delivering MHPSS services to displaced populations.
- Deploying MHPSS units to reach shelters, schools, and vulnerable communities.
- Promoting social cohesion and multicultural integration activities.
- Providing language learning and individual support sessions to assist daily integration.



### Key Results and Program Achievements

- Directly supported more than **50,000 people** in Poland.
- Strengthened services across **78 social and health care facilities**.
- Delivered comprehensive health care, psychosocial support, and integration services to displaced Ukrainians.





## Expanding Health Care Access

- Reached **33,704 people** with health care services, including medical consultations, rehabilitation support, rented medical equipment, and specialized treatment services.
- Supported access to critical care, such as blood cell transfusion services to displaced populations.



## Facility Support and Medical Assistance



- Supplied equipment and material support to **78 facilities**.
- Distributed medical supplies and equipment valued at more than **\$370,736**, strengthening response capacity across Poland.



## Mental Health and Psychosocial Support

- Reached **18,761 people** with MHPSS services, including integrated support delivered through MHPSS units.
- Established **three mobile MHPSS units**, providing outreach-based mental health care in community settings.
- Delivered **2,278 mental health consultations** to **624 people** across **13 shelters** and **one school**, ensuring accessible support for displaced families.



## Social Cohesion and Integration Support

- Reached **532 people** through social cohesion activities promoting inclusion and community resilience.
- Provided language learning opportunities to **1,518 people**, supporting integration through English and Polish classes.
- Delivered **965 individual information sessions** to **211 people**, helping refugees navigate everyday challenges such as scheduling medical appointments, writing resumes, and translating documents.



## Training and Capacity Building

- Trained **160 humanitarian actors and MHPSS specialists**, strengthening frontline capacity.
- Trained **323 school** and health care professionals, expanding trauma-informed support across institutions.
- Trained **36 children** through mental health and multicultural integration activities.





## MOLDOVA

As the humanitarian consequences of the war in Ukraine continue to affect the wider region, Project HOPE has maintained a strong operational presence in Moldova to support vulnerable populations, strengthen health systems, and expand access to essential services for refugees and host communities alike. Through an integrated approach combining health care delivery, mental health support, social cohesion, and capacity building, Project HOPE continues to provide both immediate relief and foster longer-term resilience.



### Strengthening Access to Health Care

- Supporting health care facilities with medical supplies and equipment.
- Deploying mobile medical units (home-based support care teams) to reach underserved communities.
- Providing medical vouchers to reduce barriers to care.
- Expanding screening and referral services.



### Key Results and Program Achievements

- Supported **113 health care facilities** across Moldova, strengthening service delivery and ensuring continuity of care.
- Supported over **25,500 people** through humanitarian and health programming.
- Provided **7,238 people** with health care services
- Delivered medical vouchers **to 2,016 people**, improving access to critical treatment.



### Mobile Medical Units and Consultations

- Launched **three mobile medical units** (home-based support care teams).
- Provided **7,164 medical consultations**.
- Reached **4,184 patients** through mobile services.
- Supported **397 patients** with screening services, enabling early detection and follow-up care.



## Mental Health and Psychosocial Support

- Reached **14,795 people** with MHPSS services, including group support, counseling, and community-based interventions.
- Project HOPE provided support through both dedicated programming and integrated services in mobile medical units.
- In partnership with a local partner, supported **five Child Friendly Spaces**, providing safe environments for children to heal, learn, and regain a sense of normalcy.



## Social Cohesion and Community Engagement



- Reached **1,226 people** through social cohesion programming.
- Trained **122 students** through initiatives such as the Summer Camp and Health Ambassadors activities.



## Capacity Building and Training

- Trained **78 humanitarian actors**.
- Trained **366 health care professionals** across 56 health facilities.
- Through the Patient School model of patient education, trained **289 family members** to empower caregivers with practical knowledge and skills.



## Medical Donations and Supplies

- Donated **10,777 units of pharmaceuticals**, 43,069 units of medical supplies, and 1,603 pieces of medical equipment worth over \$416,700 to primary health facilities.
- Distributed hygiene vouchers to **150 people**, supporting dignity and well-being.
